Alumni Focus

Dr Li Bing Nan

Current position: Huangshan Scholar, Full Professor, Department Head of Biomedical Engineering, Hefei University of Technology (HFUT), Hefei, China. Working on healthonics and information technology in biomedicine, with particular interests in functional medical imaging and computing.

Tell us about yourself

I was born in Changzhou, a beautiful Jiangnan city in China. Before moving to Hefei, I have studied or worked in Nanjing, Beijing, Macau, Singapore and Tokyo. In my heart, it is always exciting to challenge ourselves. Of course, my wife, Ms. SHI Mian, and my daughter, Ms. LI Siyuan, are trying their best to help me settle in.

How did the NGS PhD program benefit you, what's one memory that stands out?

The unique 2+2 NGS Scheme! Under this scheme, I was able to gain experience in NUS and the University of Tokyo which has enabled me to tackle a series of issues in hardware, software and animal experiments.

How has your experience as Department Head been so far?

With an interdisciplinary background in electronics and bioengineering, I hope to set up a system where science and engineering can meet together and work for medicine and healthcare. It is exactly the vision and mission of NGS, too. Although Biomedical Engineering (BME) is a relatively new discipline at HFUT, we have proposed four tentative thrusts: biomedical circuits and systems, biomedical materials and devices, functional medical imaging and computing, pharmaceutical engineering and drug delivery. One of biggest challenges to me is how to balance academic research and administrative duties well.

What sort of ties do you foresee can be forged between your university and NUS?

As a matter of fact, HFUT has recruited several NUS alumni, which of course includes myself. Most of us are doing pretty well. BME@HFUT is developing very quickly, and currently has a number of openings. The Vice President of HFUT visited NUS officially last year and met up with some potential candidates. I have also just disseminated our call for applications to NUS and NGS. There is a variety of academic collaborations between NUS alumni and their supervisors. So, it is foreseeable that more and more students from HFUT will be sent to NUS for joint training. We also cordially invite more NUS members to visit HFUT in the near future. Cheers!
